Methodology

The June 6th results are based on the CPAC-SES nightly tracking. It includes 1,000 interviews completed between June 2nd and June 6th.

The June 16th results are based on the CPAC-SES nightly tracking. It includes 1,000 interviews completed between June 12th and June 16th.

The margin of accuracy for each region is identified at the bottom of each regional column.

The sample is representative of the Canadian electorate both geographically and demographically. Readers should also note that percentages may not add up to 100 due to rounding. Both polls were registered with the Canadian Survey Research Council of which SES is a member.
