



STAT SHEET – SES NATIONAL OMNIBUS POLL – 2005Q2

To follow is a comparison of two separate national polls conducted by SES Research. One poll was completed prior to the Prime Minister's address between April 14th and April 18th. The second poll was completed between April 30th and May 4th, 2005. Both polls involved a separate national random telephone survey of 1,000 voters across Canada. A poll of 1,000 voters is accurate ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The research was completed in accordance with the standards of the Marketing Research and Intelligence Association (MRIA) and was registered with the MRIA. Percentages may not add up to 100 due to rounding.
