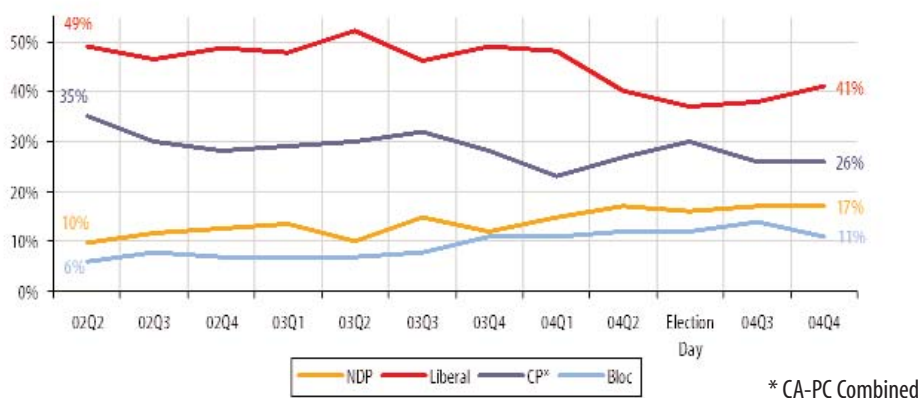

Methodology

To follow is a review of the latest SES NationState poll of 1,000 Canadians completed between October 26th and November 1st, 2004. The random telephone survey is accurate to within 3.1 percentage points, plus or minus, 19 times out of 20. The margin of accuracy will be wider for sub samples. The research was registered with the Canadian Survey Research Council of which SES is a member.
