To follow is a review of a random telephone survey of 1,003 Canadians completed between August 18th and August 23rd. The survey is accurate to within 3.1 percentage points, plus or minus, 19 times out of 20. The margin of accuracy will be wider for sub samples. Percentages may exceed 100 due to rounding. This poll was sponsored by the National Council on Canada-Arab Relations.

The research was registered with the Marketing Research and Intelligence Association of which SES is a Gold Seal Corporate Member.



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
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Question: Thinking about the next federal election and Canada's foreign policy in the Middle East, would you consider changing your preference if you disagreed with the Conservative government?

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
