Tories Losing Support: Poll Josh Pringle

Sunday, August 22, 2004

A new poll suggests support for the Conservative party of Canada has slipped to 26 per cent across the Canada.

SES Research says the Tories downward slide can be attributed to the party not being pro-active since the June 28th election.

The drop is even steeper in vote-rich Ontario, where support has trailed off to 27 per cent from an election-day high of 32 per cent.

The SES poll shows the Grits with the support of 38 per cent of committed voters.

The New Democrats are also up slightly since the June election, with 17 per cent of committed voter support.

Compared with the election day results, the Liberals and N-D-P are each up one percentage point, while the Tories are down four points.
