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### Canada's Conservatives, Liberals in a Dead Heat, SES Poll Says

June 17 (Bloomberg) -- Canada's governing Liberal Party and the Conservative Party, its main opposition, remained in a dead heat in the latest daily poll by SES Research, suggesting two television debates this week had little affect on frontrunners for the June 28 election.

Prime Minister Paul Martin's Liberals and Stephen Harper's Conservatives each had the backing of 32 percent of 600 people surveyed June 14-16, SES reported on its Web site. The Conservatives had 34 percent and the Liberals 32 percent yesterday. The poll's margin of error is 4.1 percentage points.

The New Democratic Party, led by former Toronto municipal councilor Jack Layton, gained the most after a televised debate in French in Monday and another in English on Tuesday, the SES survey suggests. The party's support rose to 21 percent from 19 percent yesterday.

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
