Ahead Start

They're back out in front again, but it's still too close to call. According to a new SES Research poll, the Liberals have regained the lead in the election by four points over the Conservatives.

The survey, which was taken on Wednesday, shows the Grits with 34 percent of decided voters. The Conservatives are close behind with 31.

The N.D.P. hovers in the 21 percent range, while the Bloc claims 12 percent in Quebec. Only three percent are planning to make their mark for the Green Party. Once again, the undecided may hold the key to the election lock. There's at least 20 percent of them across the country.

With the margin of accuracy in the poll hitting about three percent, it means the two front runners remain in a virtual dead heat heading into Monday's final decision. Paul Martin remains the choice for best Prime Minister, picked by 28 percent of those asked. Stephen Harper glides in underneath at 20 percent.

New Democrat boss Jack Layton is third at 13 percent, a gain of four points since the last survey. Those who aren't sure continue to make an impact. Twenty-two percent of Canadians simply don't know who they want to lead them.
