



OTTAWA -- The summer of discontent in Conservative Leader Stephen Harper's office continues.

Harper's highest-ranking staff member is packing up and leaving following a meeting with him yesterday morning, sources tell Sun Media.

Phil Murphy, the Tory leader's chief of staff since 2002, is the latest in a growing list of staffers who have left or were pushed out of Harper's or the party's inner circle over the past few months.

"No comment," said communications spokesman William Stairs when asked about the impending departure, adding the leader's office does not discuss human resources issues.

One source said yesterday that it wasn't clear whether Murphy had quit or was being forced out of the top staff post. Murphy has served in various backroom capacities

for conservatives on Parliament Hill for the past decade.


