# Canucks OK with national ID card except in West

OTTAWA -- Canadians would favour having a national ID card even if it's mandatory - except in the West where people balked at the idea of being forced to have it, a new SES Research/Sun Media poll shows. Hockey NORDI The survey of 1,000 people polled by SES Canada Research Inc. between May 13 and 23, shows that 51% **OUEBE** Canadians support such a card like the one Immigration Progran Minister Denis Coderre has been pushing for, while 40% Price opposed it. NHL SI HOCKI If the card was made mandatory for all Canadians, the poll MUGS found that 49% of those surveyed said they'd still support it; versus 42% who didn't . COLLE Price But in Western Canada, where there was marginal support NHL ST for the general idea of the card, 51% of the 350 people CUP W polled said they wouldn't support the idea of a national ID HOCKI card if the government required all residents to carry one, MUGS Price The SES poll is accurate within 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. Mighty Hockey SES Research president Nik Nanos said support for such a large card, will depend on whether the personal information Price contained on it is also linked to some kind of data base. Mighty "What's really at the heart of the issue is balancing a Hockey person's right to security, and personal privacy," Nanos Youth 3 Price Canadian Alliance MP Diane Ablonczy, who is skeptical DETRC about the need for the card, believes the poll results are due WINGS to the fact Canadians are law-abiding.
