


Tory defends faith school stand

The Conservative leader says Ontarians will see religious school funding as 'sensible.'

Responding to a question about an

SES Research/Sun Media poll showing support for his policy edging up, the PC leader said he will continue to fight for his plan that would provide funding to faith-based schools.

To qualify for funding, schools would have to follow the provincial curriculum, submit to provincial testing and ensure teachers have provincial certification.

"I am confident that as people understand the motivation for this policy . . . that more and more people will decide that this is a sensible thing to do as a matter of inclusion and fairness," Tory said in a scrum here yesterday.













The poll showed an almost even split among voters on the policy -- 43 per cent support it, while 50 per cent oppose it.

Tory said his policy is a question of fairness to the 53,000 kids in private, faith-based schools.

"I am doing this as a matter of principle because I think it is the right thing to do and you always fight for what is right and keep fighting for it."
