

Canadians are more suspicious of Americans than they are of us survey

Canadians are a lot more suspicious of American goods and people crossing the border than Americans are of Canadian goods and people entering the United States, according to a survey. The finding by polling firm SES Research is surprising in that it's Canada that has been accused in the U.S. of being soft on terrorism. From a list of seven major trading partners, nearly one-quarter of Canadians picked packages from the U.S. as those that should be the top priority for inspection by customs officials. Only packages from Mexico and China were seen by more Canadians as top priorities for inspection. In contrast, 5% of Americans selected packages from Canada as the No. 1 priority for inspection.
