

Support for Grits slipping, poll shows By BILL RODGERS, Parliamentary Bureau

The same-sex marriage debate and an almost daily dose of Adscam could be having an effect on the fortunes of Canada's two main political parties, a new poll conducted by SES suggests. Liberal voter support has slipped three points to 38% across the country, but they've lost a whopping 10% in voterich Ontario.

The Conservatives have gained three points nationally, rising to 29% and their support in Ontario has jumped six points to 32%.

The poll shows Grit support in the country's most populous province has plunged to 44% compared to the 54% support it enjoyed in an SES poll taken last October.

QUEBEC BUCKS TREND

Quebec is the only region where federal Liberal support grew in the latest poll -- up four points to 36%. They still trail the Bloc by nine points.

SES pollster Nik Nanos is cautious about what's causing the swings in central Canada, saying it's likely to be a combination of factors.
