

Project Overview

SES Canada Research Inc. was retained by the Osprey Media Group to conduct five regional polls as part of their coverage and analysis for the Ontario Provincial Election. Attached are the detailed data tables for the poll and a comparison of the 1999 Election Results with the current wave of polling. Listed below are the methodological notes for each of the five surveys completed for the Osprey Media Group. Geographic definitions and riding groupings were developed in conjunction with the client to reflect their major media markets in Ontario.

Osprey North Poll

Between September 17th and 19th, 2003, SES Canada Research conducted a total of 250 telephone interviews among likely provincial voters on behalf of the Osprey Media Group in Osprey's Northern Ontario media market. The survey results for the region are accurate ±6.3%, 19 times out of 20. The random sample of likely voters was drawn from a grouping of six ridings which included Sault Ste. Marie, Sudbury, Algoma-Manitoulin, Nickel Belt, Timiskaming - Cochrane, Timmins - James Bay, and Nipissing. The survey initiative was registered with the Canadian Survey Research Council of which SES Research is a member.

Osprey Central Poll

Between September 17th and 19th, 2003, SES Canada Research conducted a total of 250 telephone interviews among likely provincial voters on behalf of the Osprey Media Group in Osprey's Central Ontario media market. The survey results for the region are accurate ±6.3%, 19 times out of 20. The random sample of likely voters was drawn from a grouping of eight ridings which included Barrie-Simcoe-Bradford, Simcoe North, Simcoe Grey, Parry Sound - Muskoka, Haliburton-Victoria-Brock, Bruce-Grey-Owen Sound, Huron Bruce and Peterborough. The survey initiative was registered with the Canadian Survey Research Council of which SES Research is a member.

Osprey South West Poll

Between September 17th and 19th, 2003, SES Canada Research conducted a total of 250 telephone interviews among likely provincial voters on behalf of the Osprey Media Group in Osprey's South Western Ontario media market. The survey results for the region are accurate ±6.3%, 19 times out of 20. The random sample of likely voters was drawn from a grouping of six ridings which included Sarnia-Lambton, Lambton-Kent-Middlesex, Essex, Chatham-Kent, Elgin-Middlesex, Perth-Middlesex. The survey initiative was registered with the Canadian Survey Research Council of which SES Research is a member.

Osprey Niagara Poll

Between September 17th and 19th, 2003, SES Canada Research conducted a total of 250 telephone interviews among likely provincial voters on behalf of the Osprey Media Group in Osprey's Niagara media market. The survey results for the region are accurate ±6.3%, 19 times out of 20. The random sample of likely voters was drawn from a grouping of seven ridings which included Niagara Falls, Erie-Lincoln, St. Catharines, Niagara Centre, Stoney Creek, Ancaster-Dundas Flamborough-Aldershot and Brant. The survey initiative was registered with the Canadian Survey Research Council of which SES Research is a member.

Osprey East Poll

Between September 17th and 19th, 2003, SES Canada Research conducted a total of 250 telephone interviews among likely provincial voters on behalf of the Osprey Media Group in Osprey's Eastern Ontario media market. The survey results for the region are accurate ±6.3%, 19 times out of 20. The random sample of likely voters was drawn from a grouping of eight ridings which included Stormont-Dundas-Charlottenburg, Leeds-Grenville, Kingston and the Islands, Hastings-Frontenac-Lennox &Addington, Lanark-Carleton, Northumberland, Prince Edward – Hastings, Renfrew-Nipissing-Pembroke. The survey initiative was registered with the Canadian Survey Research Council of which SES Research is a member.
